**155 Rounds Road, Port Campbell**

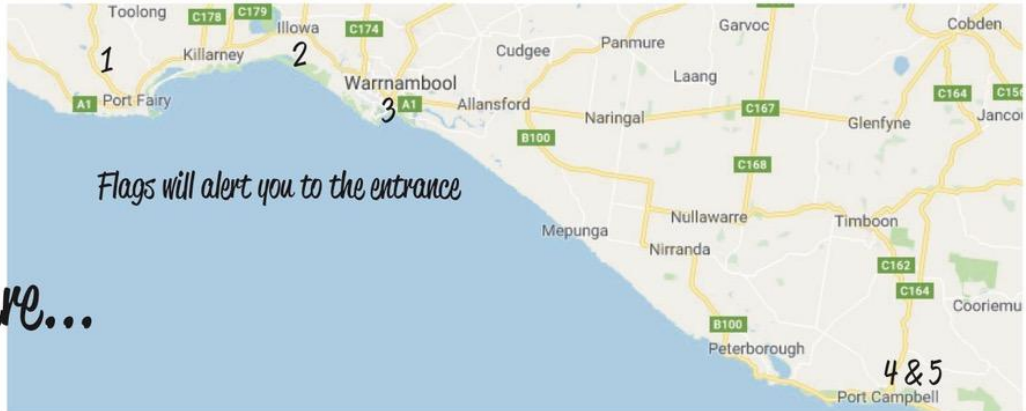
